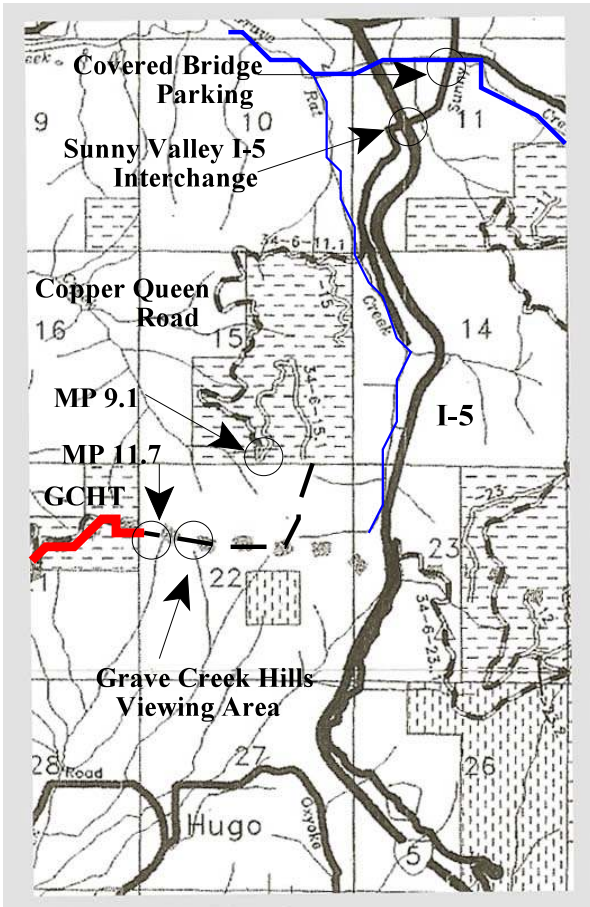


Grave Creek Hills Elevation: 1,900' - 2,749'

The start of the GCHT is approximately 12 miles and 40 minutes from the Hugo I-5 interchange (Map 1).

The Hills' elevation ranges from 1,900' to 2,749' with several viewpoints both into Hugo and Sunny Valley.

GCHT Part Of Copper Queen Old Growth Grove

The GCHT is located on a 240-acre BLM parcel presently allocated to forest production (Map 1). You can drive to the eastern edge of the GCHT on the Copper Queen Road (see mile posts). The GCHT is in the southeast area of the BLM parcel located in an approximately 60-acre stand identified locally as the Copper Queen Old Growth Grove.

9.1	"Y" in Road and start of mostly dirt logging rd.
9.3	Start 4-wheel drive
11.0	Enter First Clear Cut on Ridge of Grave Creek Hills (scenic views start)
11.4	Minor Saddle in Range at View Point
11.7	End of Road and Start of GCHT

WARNING! There is a personal risk the individual assumes anytime he ventures into the "wilds" of Hugo. Non-paved roads can be dangerous anytime, but especially in near vertical terrain (i.e., narrow, steep, curvy, blind corners, edge of cliff, poor road material, overhanging vegetation, mud holes, loose rocks, changing conditions, etc.). Grave Creek Hills Trail (GCHT) Very Scenic

The GCHT is approximately one-half mile long one-way on a quad trail from the eastern boundary of the BLM parcel west to the Grave Creek Hills' saddle, and back out for a total of a mile.

Warning The drive from the Hugo I-5 interchange to the start of the Grave Creek Hills Trail is on pavement and gravel roads (two-wheel drive to four-wheel drive). It is not advised to drive the new four-wheel drive area after the "Y" at mile 9.1 when the road is wet.
