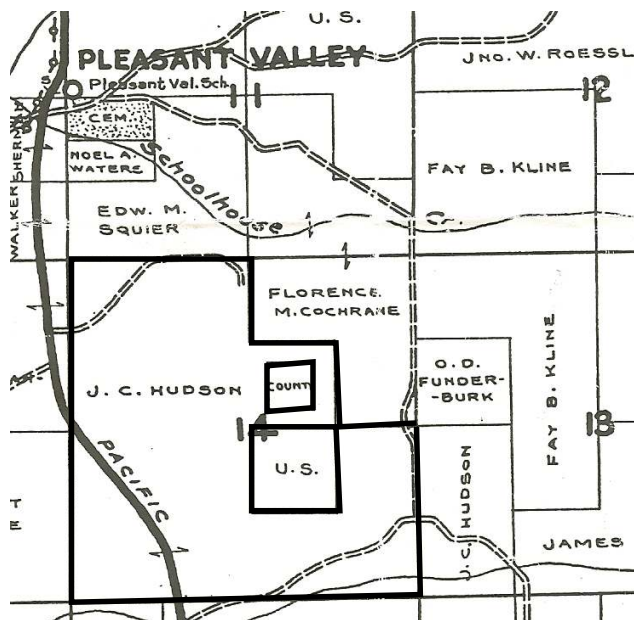

Catherina A. Hudson	Wife	OR	68 yrs

Joseph's occupation was farming his own farm.

1932 J. C. Hudson was in possession of approximately 170 acres in the Schoolhouse drainage.
