1876 Hugo Homestead On August 15, 1876 Garrett Crockett was issued a homestead patent for 160 acres in Hugo, Oregon (Patent No. 702).¹

1912 Sixteen freight cars, nearly all loaded with way or through freight are in the ditch one mile south at Three Pines, a broken car wheel having caused the wreck of an extra out of Roseburg running as No. 221." Several railroad officials, . . . "including **J. D. Cook, lumberman; Geo. Dean, blacksmith, and Lyndon Banister, farmer**, constituted a board of inquiry that looked into the causes of the wreck. Their report, filed Wednesday noon, finds that no one was responsible for the wreck, it being one of those things that just happens." Rogue River Courier. January 19, 1912. S.P. Freight Train No. 221 Wrecked.

Both Lyndon and his son are laborers in a box factory.

1950 Lyndon K. Banister passed in Klamath County, Oregon. His wife was Frances.⁴

Bannister Creek is named after the Banister family, presumably because of the Lyndon V. Banister's tenure of the old Garrett Crockett homestead which is at the confluence of that creek (i.e., that will be named Banister Creek) and Jumpoff Joe Creek.

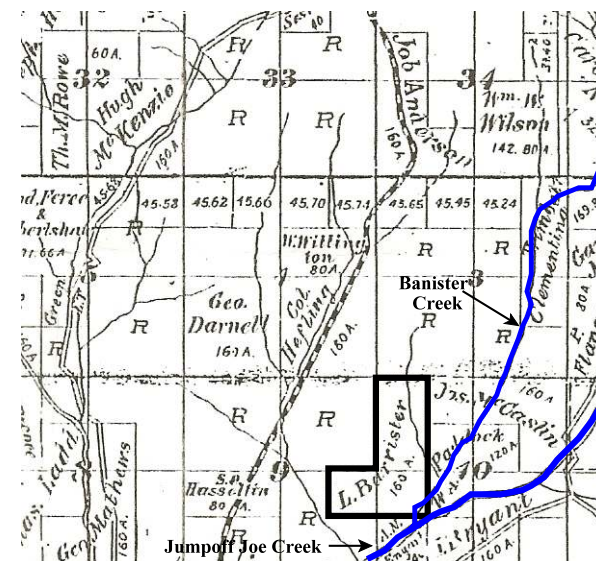
