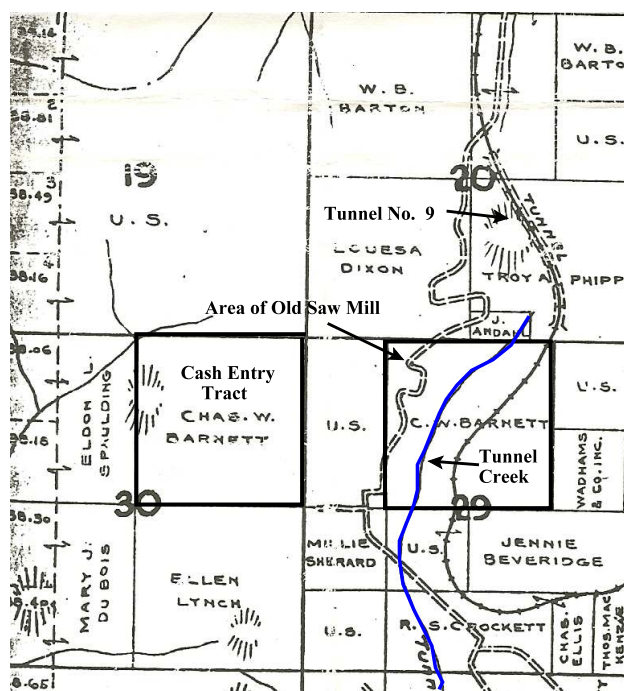
1920 - 1930 Census A Clarence C. Barnett was in Grants Pass, but he was 3 years old in 1920.

1930 A Charles W. Barnett was in Portland, Oregon.

1930 Charles Barnett Cash Entry Barnett purchased 160 acres under Cash Entry No. 018063 in Josephine County, Oregon. It was issued July 23, 1930 to Charles W. Barnett (April 24, 1820: Sale-Cash Entry (3 Stat. 566)).¹⁻²

Charles Barnett Family, Hugo Settlers: ca., 1930s - 19??

1932 A few years later Barnett owned an additional 160 acres in the form of the old Decker homestead.³

Cash Entry Tract

1940s - 1950s There was a saw mill about a quarter to half a mile south of the south entrance of Tunnel No. 9 on the old Tunnel Creek Road that people used to use to go to Tunnel No. 9. It is blocked off today. Pat Whiting in the late 1940s and 1950s could have been the owner after Charles Barnett.⁴

1955 By 1955 a Metsker map documents that the east Barnett tract (old Decker homestead) was in the possession of Bate Lumber Company.⁵

The west tract (cash entry) was in the possession of Josephine County.

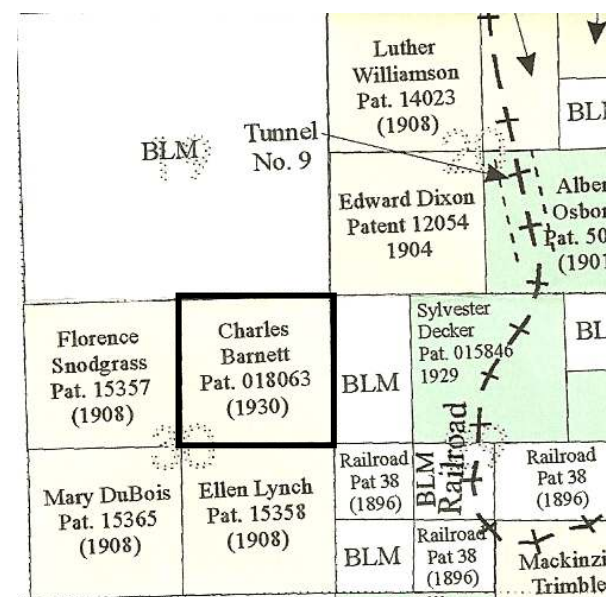
