1917 On June 5, 1917 Carl Husen registered for the WWI draft while he was in Iowa.

He was single, blue eyed, and light haired short in height and medium in stature. His occupation was farm laborer

He had seven months experience in the infantry as a private with the Iowa United States Army.

WWI Carl Husen was a corporal in WWI.
