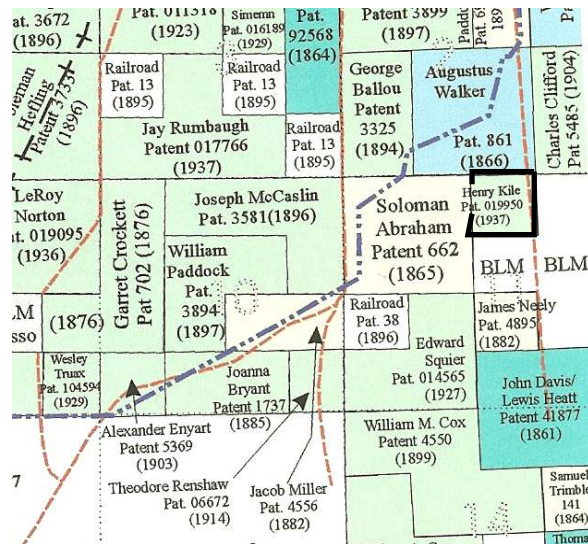

Henry Kile Family, Early Hugo Settler Family: ca., 1940s - 19??

1937 Henry Kile's Hugo Homestead On September 29, 1937 Henry W. Kile was issued a homestead certificate for 40 acres in Hugo, Oregon (Patent No. 019950).¹⁻²

This was a very late homestead. It was located adjacent to the second oldest cash entries in Hugo, Oregon. Solomon purchased 160 acres under Cash Entry No. 662 in Josephine County, Oregon. It was issued August 15, 1865 to Solomon Abraham (April 24, 1820: Sale-Cash Entry (3 Stat. 566)).¹⁻²

1920³ The opening of further tracts in the forfeited O. & C. land grant to homestead settlement is attracting the attention of the land hungry of the nation, and thousands will be attracted to Oregon to investigate the lands. Not all who come will settle on these tracts, but many who do not find fortune in that direction will become interested in other lands, and there will be a great stimulation in land movement. These visitors from the east are not going to return from the west once they have seen the advantages offered for home building here.
