**1912** S. V. Pettenger, for many years, and at the present time postmaster at Grave, this county, was in the city Thursday consulting a physician in regard to his health, which has not been of the best for the past two weeks. Mrs. Wm. Light is assisting in putting up and weighing the mails while the postmaster is ill. Mr. Pettenger was 80 years old the 18<sup>th</sup> of July this year. *Rogue River Courier*. November 8, 1910. Grave Postmaster Ill.

**1920** Mr. and Mrs. Wm. Light made a business trip to Grants Pass Monday. *Rogue River Courier*. March 26, 1920. Hugo.
